[This inventory evidently consists of two very decayed sheets. The right side is missing, and there is extensive damage elsewhere. It may be possible to read the residue from the original but the copy is largely impossible. However some significant information can be extracted.

A typical sized local house would appear to be involved, with bed chambers over other rooms. No farm stock or land is mentioned. The house contains a large stock of dress material and other goods, under a heading that may read "shop". No valuations or total survives.

The name Francis Knight cannot be read in the copy. The year 1675 is readable in the probate.

The first room would appear to be her "Lodging Chamber" with typical furniture. At least two more bed chambers are listed after that. The next room appears to be the Kitchen with fitches of bacon etc. but with no long list of implements.

The second leaf would appear to be headed, "In the S[hop]". Immediately afterwards there follows a list of materials, although the names are missing. Item 19 yards of....., It 21 yards of....., It 27 yards....., It 12 [?], It 8 yards....., It 3 [?]....., It 7 [?]....., It [] of linsey..., several other items follow, and probably including remnants of holland and callico; and boxes of goods. The shop and possibly a store house are mentioned towards the end.]
